Faced with a flat budget, price increases, rising student numbers, reduced staffing, increased demand for ILLs, and the introduction of a new Resource List system, how can we make all the numbers add up? This interactive presentation aims to share a 'behind the scenes' view of some key projects and reviews over the past 5 years in Library and Learning Services at De Montfort University, with a focus on Acquisitions.

As part of a strategic investment programme across Colleges, the University of Derby Library collated and compared information including usage, turnaways and Inter-Library Loans data to target purchases of new journals, databases and resources. This talk will discuss how the Library liaised with academics to identify potential resources; how data was collated, analysed and presented to make a case and aid decisions around purchasing; and how the Library is promoting the resources to students.
