# What makes 2<sup>nd</sup> Year such a challenge?

- ▶ “The sophomore slump” (second child syndrome)
- ▶ Huge changes to their daily life (bills, house sharing, cooking)
- ▶ For many “the second year blues” have begun before they return to university



## The next step

- ▶ Pressure that what they do now really counts
- ▶ Expectation of lecturers for students to take ownership of their learning – reading around the subject and independent research
- ▶ Added pressure of securing a placement as well as completing coursework and revising for exams



# When the serious work starts

- ▶ 1<sup>st</sup> Year at Aston doesn't count towards final degree classification
- ▶ 2<sup>nd</sup> year weighting depends on the programme
  - ▶ 15% if doing a placement year, 25% if not doing a placement



# Re-induction

- ▶ Target returning students in Week 1



# Key messages

## ▶ Collaboration with Careers and Employability Team

- ▶ Workshops part of Careers Workshop Programme and embedded into Employability Modules across Schools



- ▶ Systematic Review workshop for Psychology

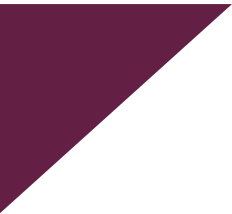
# What can we do to further support students

- ▶ Improve the **transition** from 1<sup>st</sup> Year to 2<sup>nd</sup> Year
  - ▶ Engage with them over the long Summer break
  - ▶ Monthly email with latest news and developments
    - ▶ Highlight key resources (remind them they have access to everything off-campus)
  - ▶ Use social media to help them feel part of the Library
    - ▶ Photos, videos, case studies



# Enhancing support for students

- ▶ **Collaborate** with colleagues in Learning Development
  - ▶ Top tips videos
  - ▶ Webinars on referencing, academic writing, critical appraisal
  - ▶ Work with writing mentors (peer learning)
  - ▶ Promote Skype appointments



# Enhancing support for students

- ▶ Use any opportunity to get feedback and verbatim comments from previous 2<sup>nd</sup> years
  - ▶ Student endorsement is really powerful
  - ▶ Make use of the student ambassador scheme
