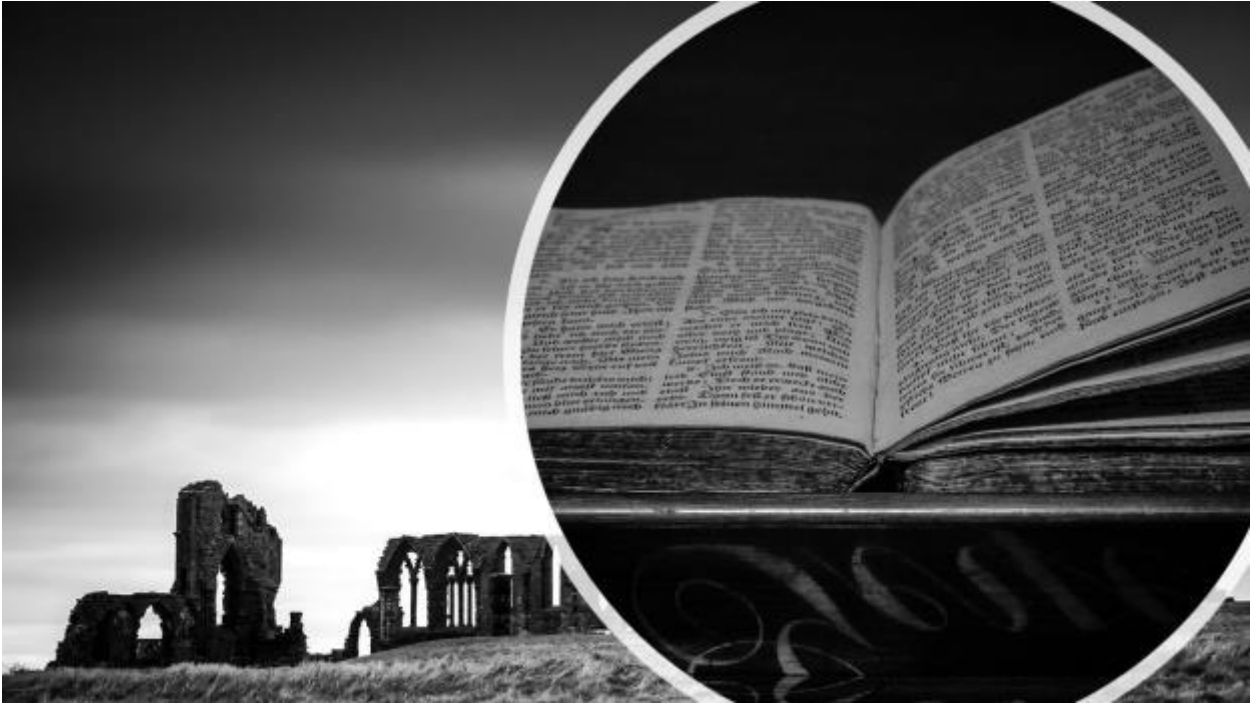

Welcome to the Library Treasure Hunt!



The Library is full of treasure, from intriguing primary sources to top quality journals and informative monographs written by world renowned experts. However, it can be a bit overwhelming and some of it can be tricky to find, even if you know what you are looking for.

In this Treasure Hunt we want you to use your searching skills to find the missing words in a secret phrase (knowledge is a treasure after all).

For each clue you need to find a word to help complete a phrase. You may find yourself with the reference of a source you need to find, while others may be more tricky and you won't be given as much detail. If you ever get stuck don't forget you can ask the session hosts for additional clues.

How does this work?

You will begin by clicking on 'Clue 1'. Once you have the answer to Clue 1 you will click on Clue 2 and enter that answer as your password. If it is correct, you will enter Clue 2. If it is incorrect you will need to try again. You repeat this throughout the Treasure Hunt until you have found all of the passwords and have completed the secret phrase in the section 'The treasure!'

TIP: The passwords are case sensitive. For this treasure hunt all the passwords will be lowercase

We will give you the password to unlock your first room during the session. Once you have the password, click on Clue 1 to begin. The password to begin is *onwards*.
