

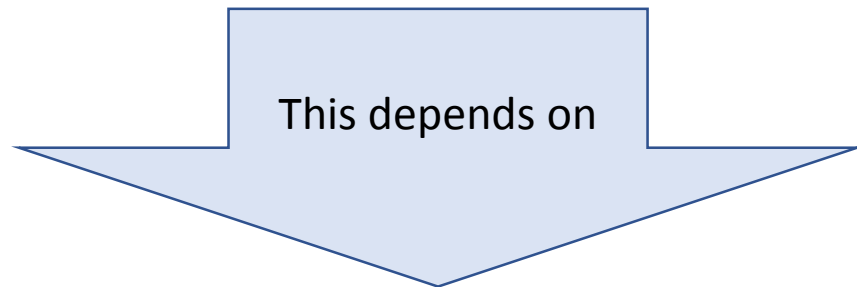

# The end user experience depends on 2 things

## 1. Nature of the file

eg formats, navigability, reading order etc.

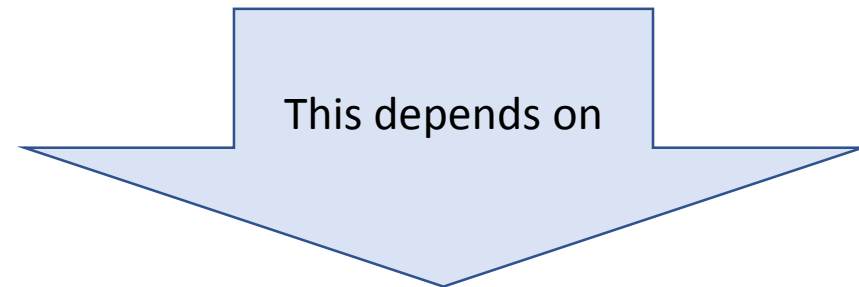


## Publishers

eg Sage, Pearson, MacMillan

## 2. Nature of the platform

eg accessible reading features, compatibility with assistive technology etc.



## Platform providers

eg Askew and Holts, ProQuest  
AND some publisher platforms eg Elsevier  
Science Direct, Cambridge Online.

So two audits exist

## **Publisher audit**

Focused on *information provided* about the files, the formats, the DRM, the compatibility with assistive technologies and alternative format provision.

## **Platform audit**

Focused on *information provided* about the accessibility features of the platform interface and online reading experience.

# And we need to manage the process

## Requirement

- Ensure an even spread of audits to maximise coverage and statistical validity.
- Ensure questions are unambiguous.
- Do the audit
