# Introduction from Gaz Johnson giving some background on the Mercian Collaboration and an overview of future objectives:

The Mercian Collaboration (MC) formed in late 2014, partly from the merger of the pre-existing East and West Midlands Libraries training groups, but also as a consolidated effort from the Directors of SCONUL member regional HE libraries. The MC comprises 22 academic library members, who each pay a subscription fee based on their JISC Band to support the MC's aspirations and activities. Each member library's Director (or equivalent) sits on the Mercian Directors' Committee, a board forming the organisation's ultimate decision making tier. Operationally the MC is led by a Steering Group, whose members are elected from among the Directors, on a two yearly term basis. Currently, this group is chaired by Dave Parkes (DMU), with Diane Job (Birmingham) as his Vice-Chair, with a treasurer (Paul Reynolds, Keele) and three ordinary SG members rounding out this group.

Now in its third year, the MC has begun to identify its core priorities, many of which revolve around workforce development, manifesting through events and special interest groups, but also in the proposed buddying and talent management schemes. However, the benefits of collective agency, lobbying and procurement from collaborative working are also of keen interest to the MC. Directors regularly review these focuses at their biannual meetings. There are three other subgroups: Staff Development (SDG), Conference (CG) and Research Data Management (RDM), with SDG being the longest standing. Groups' interests are represented by the MCDO in direct liaison with each subgroup's chair and through regular and annual reports to the Directors' Committee. However, this will be enhanced in the near future once SG sponsors are allocated to each subgroup. It is anticipated that staff and Directors will enjoy enhanced collegiality and a greater awareness of activities within their regional compatriots' libraries.

The crucial operational role of MC Libraries Development Officer (MCDO) arose in mid-2015, with Gareth J Johnson appointed to the role in November 2015. Working one day a week and reporting directly to the Chair and SG, Gareth's role is to act as the MC's secretariat; meaning he facilitates communications between subgroups, directors and the SG, attends meetings as the SG's representative, runs the website, handles marketing and brand management, performs external and intercollaboration liaison, along with maintaining oversight and advising on

governance procedures and protocols. He is an ex-officio member of all Mercian committees and subgroups, and wherever possible attends their meetings and events to provide continuity and insight across the Collaboration's activities.
