6). Ebooks and accessibility of databases

General consensus that it is difficult to work with the many different ebook platforms which are available and to know about, or understand, the accessibility of each - general consensus that the Jisc ebook audit may prove helpful

Natasha mentioned testing some platforms with assistive tech and the group were interested in the results of this. Natasha also mentioned that Askews were doing in-house testing as well.

Janice spoke about databases with audio options and everyone agreed that these tools seemed helpful but there was no consistency on what's available and no consultation with users around what's useful. General discussion around platforms removing and changing features based on stats rather than usability

7). Assistive technology (AT) and the bigger picture

At Nottingham, BM outlined the current gap in provision for an assistive tech lead and the idea of moving towards an inclusive curriculum with embedded 'productivity tools'

At Warwick the AT falls to Laura but it isn't technically in her role

- there is some budget for AT within libraries but not for networked software

Natasha: IT have very little input and don't support it

Vicki:

- AT not used and has been moved out to the Enabling Centre.
- roaming profiles which allow for personalisation of the desktop.
- Digital Capability project JISC Digital Capability Framework
 - Training for staff
 - Free apps plus training
 - o Digital U student tracker and Digital Capability questionnaire

DMU - Carol talked through the Disability Enhancement Project

Assistive Tech post

- Library based as no one in IT
- Workshops, 121s
- Writes funding bids an IT then buy the software/hardware
- Universal Design for Learning technology strand horizon scanning
- Raise awareness of software
- Next year home licences
- Centre for Learning collaborative projects

Janice - Bishop Grosseteste have Digital Champions but support is siloed with pockets of expertise which don't talk to each other.
